**ORDER AMENDING RULE 5 OF THE RULES OF
PROCEDURE FOR JUVENILE COURTS**

This matter came before the Court upon its own motion following the repeal of the “Rules of the Supreme Court of Wyoming Providing for the Organization and Government of the Bar Association and Attorneys at Law of the State of Wyoming” and the adoption of the “Rules Governing the Wyoming State Bar and the Authorized Practice of Law.” Based on those changes, this Court finds that Rule 5 of the Rules of Procedure for Juvenile Courts should be updated. It is, therefore,

ORDERED that the amendments to Rule 5 of the Rules of Procedure for Juvenile Courts, attached hereto, be and hereby are adopted by the Court to be effective immediately; and it is further

ORDERED that this order and the attached amendments shall be published in the advance sheets of the Pacific Reporter; the attached amendments shall be published in the Wyoming Court Rules Volume; and that this order and the attached amendments shall be published online at the Wyoming Judicial Branch’s website, <http://www.courts.state.wy.us>. The amendments shall thereafter be spread at length upon the journal of this Court.

Rules of Procedure for Juvenile Courts

Rule 5. Right to counsel.

(a) Right to Counsel, Generally. The Respondent is entitled to be represented in all proceedings in Juvenile Court by counsel retained by him, his parent, or by counsel appointed pursuant to this Rule. An out-of-state attorney may enter his appearance and participate in a case only after having been admitted in accordance with Rule 8 of the Rules Governing the Wyoming State Bar and the Authorized Practice of Law ~~11 of the Rules of the Supreme Court of Wyoming Providing for the Organization and Government of the Bar Association and Attorneys at Law of the State of Wyoming~~, and Rule 104 of the Uniform Rules for the District Courts of the State of Wyoming (admission Pro Hac Vice). Once so admitted, his appearance and participation is limited by the restrictions of those rules.
