**ORDER AMENDING RULE 105 OF THE RULES AND PROCEDURES
GOVERNING ADMISSION TO THE PRACTICE OF LAW**

The Officers and Commissioners of the Wyoming State Bar have recommended that the Wyoming Supreme Court amend Rule 105 of the Rules and Procedures Governing Admission to the Practice of Law. The Court, having carefully reviewed the proposed amendments, finds that the proposed amendments should be adopted. It is, therefore,

ORDERED that the amendments to Rule 105 of the Rules and Procedures Governing Admission to the Practice of Law, attached hereto, be and hereby are adopted by the Court to be effective January 1, 2009; and it is further

ORDERED that the amendments to Rule 105 of the Rules and Procedures Governing Admission to the Practice of Law, attached hereto, shall be published in the advance sheets of the Pacific Reporter, the Wyoming Reporter, and in the Wyoming Court Rules; and that the amendments to Rule 105 of the Rules and Procedures Governing Admission to the Practice of Law shall thereupon be spread at length upon the journal of the Court.

**RULES AND PRODEDURES GOVERNING ADMISSION TO
THE PRACTICE OF LAW**

Rule 105. Waivers.

The Board may, for good cause shown by clear and convincing evidence, waive any rule ~~contained herein~~, bylaw or approval required from the Board of Law Examiners which relates to the admission to the practice of law in Wyoming; provided, however, the Board shall not waive filing fees, ~~including late fees~~, nor shall the Board waive the prohibition on regrading of essay answers after the general release of grades. The decision of the Board not to waive any rule herein subject to waiver may be appealed to the Court.
