## GENERAL ORDER TEMPORARILY MODIFYING TERMS OF THE 24/7 PROGRAM

THIS MATTER came upon the Court's own motion. The President of the United States has declared a national emergency. The Governor of the State of Wyoming has declared a statewide emergency. The Wyoming Supreme Court implemented the Judicial Branch: Respiratory Disease Pandemic Plan, and the Circuit Court has implemented its Pandemic Mitigation Plan (PMP). Each of these actions are in response to the worldwide pandemic involving COVID 2019.

The Centers for Disease Control (CDC) have implemented best practices to avoid further transmission of COVID-19. Those best practices include, but are not limited to:

- Minimizing/Eliminating all person-to-person contact
- Maintaining a minimum distance of six (6) feet between persons
- Avoiding gatherings of more than 50 people
- Practicing proper hygiene (washing hands, cover when coughing, disinfecting).

The 24/7 Program is an important part of sentencing and bond options for judges, and allows persons to remain in the community who might otherwise await trial in jail or serve time in jail or prison. Notwithstanding the freedom afforded defendants and the safety afforded members of the community by the program, examination of the program's procedures reveals it is being operated in a manner which may be in conflict with some aspects of CDC guidance.

For this reason, the 24/7 Program will be modified effective immediately to better comply with CDC guidance whiles still protecting the public. These modifications will be implemented by Campbell County Detention Center (CCDC) staff overseen by the presiding judge.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that effective immediately all bond orders and probation orders are deemed modified to comply with CCDC's amended 24/7 procedures; and

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that all other terms and conditions of existing bonds and probation orders shall remain in full force and effect.
