NON-RESIDENT VIOLATOR COMPACT

You have been issued a citation that is forfeitable, meaning you can pay the fine without going to court. You have two choices: you may contest the citation, or you may pay it.

If you contest the citation, you will appear in Court, enter a plea of “Not Guilty,” and begin the process in preparation for trial.

If you are not contesting the offense listed on the citation, and you do not currently have the money to pay your fines, please take note:

- The Non-Resident Violator Compact allows the Department of Transportation to issue sanctions against your license if your fines are not paid.
- If you fail to pay the full amount of the citation by the date indicated, your citation will become overdue.
 - This means that the Court staff will run a report which will indicate you have not made payment. Once this report has been generated a letter is sent to you explaining that your payment is due in twenty (20) days. If the citation is not paid in the twenty (20) days, a report is sent to the Wyoming Department of Transportation for further action.
 - In approximately fifteen to forty-five (15-45) days the Wyoming Department of Transportation may suspend your license and it will remain suspended until the fines are paid. Additionally, your license will remain suspended until you pay the license reinstatement fee, (a financial sanction that is imposed by the Wyoming Department of Transportation).
 - Some statutes for forfeitable citations are not eligible to go through the NRVC procedure and if the money is not paid at the end of the twenty (20) day period a WARRANT may be issued
 - While your license is suspended you will not be permitted to get a license in any other participating Non-Resident Violator Compact state. This information is shared with the compact agreeing states and currently forty-four states participate in the agreement.

You can pay your citation at any time prior to the end of the twenty (20) day letter without any sanctions being imposed on you or your license. The Court does not have methods which authorize community service or allow you to work toward paying the amount owed.

The Court will not reduce the amount of the fine assessed by the officer who wrote the citation. The amount is set by the Wyoming Supreme Court and this Court will not deviate from the amount assessed.
