To the extent practicable, the clerks wear masks while working; the Judge wears a mask while in the area where the clerks work; and generally, the court clerks do not enter the Judge's chambers.

The Chief Clerk, to a greater extent, and the other clerks, to a lesser extent, will continue to stagger shifts and work from home.

Teton County has installed a temporary 36"-long plexiglass shield at the counter where the clerks meet with the public. The County plans to replace this shield with a longer permanent shield that extends the length of the counter. The County is following the same procedure in other buildings.

The Court has 4 clerk stations/desks. Chief Clerk and Deputy Clerks 1, 2 & 3. The Court has requested the County to install a plexiglass shield between the desks of Deputy Clerks 2 & 3, who sit approximately 6 feet apart.

During videoconference hearings, the Judge remains in chambers while the clerk sits in the courtroom and operates Liberty Recording and the Surface Hub.



X Among Public

As of June 1, 2020, Teton County is requiring all members of the public entering the Courthouse to wear a face covering in all public areas of the Courthouse and maintain at least 6 feet social distancing. The Circuit Court shall impose the same requirements in the Circuit Court offices and courtroom. Further, the Courthouse stakeholders (District Court & Circuit Court Judges, County Attorney, Clerk of Court and Sheriff) have agreed upon the attached Phase Orange Plan for Reopening the Teton County Courthouse & In-person Court Proceedings, which addresses security screening, signage, floor markers, and restrictions on queuing. The court bailiffs have marked locations for standing and sitting in the courtroom and public areas. Counsel shall remain at counsel tables. The Surface Hub is available for presenting documents and videos. Law enforcement witnesses and other witnesses who do not need security screening may be able to enter the courtroom directly from outside via the Jury Room and thereby avoid the more congested public areas of the Courthouse. In pretrial proceedings in criminal proceedings, the Court rmay require the prosecuting attorney to appear by videoconference. The Court will encourage remote testimony; and may require remote testimony in certain cases.

Requests to use the public terminal shall be made in advance to avoid unnecessary waiting.

On the first floor of the Courthouse, there are hand sanitizer dispensers at the entrance to the building, the entrance to the Circuit Courtroom, and building exit. County Facilities has been asked to install another dispenser near the entrance to the Circuit Court offices (which is also near the entrance to the Teton County Attorney's Office). Persons entering the Circuit Court offices will be required to use hand sanitizer upon entry. In the courtroom, hand sanitizer dispensers shall be available at counsel table.
