Jury Trial Protocol During COVID-19 Pandemic

General guidelines

- All persons entering the courtroom will check in with the Clerk of Court prior to entry into the courtroom
- Entry into the courtroom constitutes agreement with this protocol
- Masks and/or face shields are required and will be made available for use by all
- Prior to entry, all persons entering the courtroom will utilize the sanitary station to clean hands
- Participants will sit in assigned seating
- Observers/members of the public will sit in marked places only.
 - Only persons attending with members of their immediate family unit, those within the same office, or the Defendant and his/her counsel will be allowed to violate the 6-foot rule—they will be allowed to violate the rule, but space will be provided to allow for adherence to the 6-foot rule.
- Counsel are encouraged to socially distance from their clients and staff, and to utilize masks when violating social distancing protocols
- The courtroom and jury room will be cleaned each evening and between the morning and afternoon sessions

Pre-Trial Matters

■ The Parties will submit to the Court all exhibits they intend to publish to the jury (other than audio/visual files) along with 8 copies of the exhibits. There will be an exhibit notebook provided for the Court along with an exhibit notebook utilized on the witness stand

Voir Dire

- During check-in, each potential juror will be asked about their health and willingness to serve
- Ask COVID screening questions and take temperatures
- During Voir Dire—the panel, attorneys, Defendant will be provided with face shields to wear so expressions can be observed
- Those not selected for Jury Duty will be excused

Sequestration / Welcome of Observers

Following the selection of the jury which will hear the case, witnesses will be sequestered, and observers/members of the public will be admitted subject to courtroom protocols outlined herein.

Opening Statements:

The litigants will deliver opening statements and questioning from their own podium where social distancing can be maintained.

Witness examination

- Witnesses will testify from the witness box
- Counsel will examine witnesses from the counsel tables or from their assigned podium

Exhibits will not be published to the jury by hand; any exhibits counsel wish to be published will be shown using available multimedia technology or through exhibit notebooks stipulated too prior to the commencement of trial

Bench conferences

All participants will wear a mask during any bench conference

Jury Instructions / Exhibits

- Jury instructions, once agreed upon and delivered by the Court, will remain with the Court
 - The jury will receive a copy of the jury instructions reproduced by the Court and handled only by an individual following proper protocol
- The prosecution and the defense will, not later than the first morning of the first day of trial, provide the Court with a Binder containing all exhibits intended to be introduced
 - o The Court will secure the jury binder(s) until the case is handed to the jury, at which point the court will remove any exhibit(s) not entered into evidence
 - o The Court will then provide the binder(s) to the jury

Jury Deliberations

- Jurors will deliberate from assigned seating in jury room
- Jurors will be encouraged to take a 10-minute respite every hour and to exit the jury room during that time
- Food items provided to the jurors will be individually wrapped items and the jurors will need to maintain social distancing

Return of Verdict

■ Presiding Juror will deliver verdict to the Court
