## ORDER RESCINDING COVID-19 OPERATING PLAN FOR THE SUPREME COURT BUILDING, APPLICATIONS OPERATIONS IN THE HERSCHLER BUILDING, AND EQUAL JUSTICE WYOMING IN THE HATHAWAY BUILDING

This matter came before the Court upon its own motion. The Wyoming Supreme Court adopted its COVID-19 Operating Plan (Plan) for the Supreme Court building and offices in the Herschler and Hathaway buildings on June 23, 2020. The Plan was revised several times to meet changing conditions, most recently on April 8, 2021. Given the wide availability of a COVID-19 vaccine and the recission of certain Wyoming Department of Health orders, the Court finds that a gradual return to pre-COVID-19 operations is appropriate; it is therefore

**ORDERED** that the COVID-19 Operating Plan Dated April 8, 2021, is rescinded; and it is

**FURTHER ORDERED** that the Supreme Court building and Supreme Court offices in the Herschler and Hathaway buildings will remain open, subject to the conditions set forth below until further order of the Court:

- 1. The Supreme Court building and the Supreme Court offices in the Herschler and Hathaway buildings, subject to state building policy, will be open to the public;
- 2. Court personnel will follow state and local health orders while in the building or office areas; and
- 3. The Judicial Learning Center will remain closed, and entry will be permitted by appointment only.
